Introduction

The Ministry of Foreign Relations of the Principality of Sancratosia is proud to unveil its 2022 study of UN member states and other independent entities and its official recommendation on the states which are deemed aligned or partially aligned with Sancratosian values. The following list is mostly based on the recognition of LBGTQ+ rights in each countries and the general policies of the states. Out of the 256 countries and sovereign entities surveyed, 118 are aligned or partially aligned with Sancratosian values, with a total of 59 that are not at all aligned with Sancratosian values.

Methodology

Countries are given points for each of the following elements:

- They are signatories of the UN Declaration of LGBT rights (0.5 point);
- They recognize same-sex sexual relations (1 point);
- They recognize same-sex civil unions (1 point);
- They recognize same-sex marriage (1 point);
- They have laws preventing some (0.5 point) or all (1 point) discrimination;
- They have laws that prevent discrimination on gender identity or expression (0.5 point) and/or they recognize legal gender changes without sterilization (1 point).

The highest total of points is 7.5, of which 40 countries and sovereign entities have achieved. Some countries that have achieved high numbers were not included because of their other policies which endangers individuals, such as Israel.
